When Armando and Carlos Pena set off to carry their mother's ashes back to South Texas and reunite with their brothers, the road reveals more than they bargained for. Two brothers attempt to decipher their family's story to find out why their mother Rosa was outcast by her own family; and what happened to their father Pedro, who disappeared during the notorious 1954 U.S. government deportation program, "Operation Wetback," when over a million Mexican and Mexican Americans were forced across the border.
